### James Hornsby School Sports Partnership - (JHS)

We have joined the partnership again this year. It is now being run by a new School Games Organiser (SGO) Yanoula Dellas with close guidance from Emily Nichols who is head of PE at JHS and who has previously had the role. As a school, we are looking to attend as many sporting events as possible, throughout the year.

# Further development of Extra Curriculum Clubs and establishing links with local clubs

The development of the Muga pitch has now been completed and the pupils have enjoyed using this over the past few months. This has allowed the pupils to take part in multiple activities in their P.E lessons and at lunchtimes and playtimes and this has broadened the children's options. The Muga pitch has given the pupils more opportunities to access the physical benefits of play. This has been a great opportunity for the children to develop their cardiovascular fitness and overall body strength.

We are aiming to target as many pupils as possible across the school to attend extra curriculum PE. We have now combined the KS1 and KS2 Multi-sports clubs into a year 2, Year 3-4 and a year 5-6 multi-sports club. All of the multi-sports clubs are funded by sports premium. In addition, a Year 1, Year 2, Year 3-4, Year 5-6 and an all-girls football club is being run by the SPEC Training Team.

The football clubs are now also a path way to the school football team. In addition, the SPEC training team has been arranging friendlies and entering tournaments against other schools. Next year the team's aim to keep a constant calendar all year round, and be as competitive as possible in as many fixtures and tournaments.

We are continuing the running of the after school dance clubs for KS1 and KS2. In addition to this we are now providing an extra dance session for the on a Friday afternoon for our SEN children. SPEC training is providing this free of charge.

We are also running a netball club after school on a Monday, this has been aimed at children in years 3 to 6. As the club is now a charged club, the uptake on numbers has not been great so far. We will be looking to see If we can get this back as a free teacher led club again In September if we have a teacher skilled in netball. We are also looking at getting an after school basketball club up and running too in the new year.

Again, we will be tracking participation levels next year to ensure that we encourage as many pupils as possible to attend one or more extra curriculum activity in addition to P.E. We have had a slight decrease of pupils attending clubs this term. This is due to cancellation of the Tag rugby club and netball club becoming a paid club. However, with extra clubs being provided in September we should have an increase in children attending before and after school activities. We will continuously be tracking this and monitoring this.

# Development of G & T across the school & Attendance at sporting events (coaches fees and transport costs)

Damon and Joe (SPEC Training Schools) are currently training the Gifted and Talented Group for districts in July, this year we have both year 3-4 and year 5-6 competing which is being held by the JHS partnership at the sporting village.

Going forward into next year, the school will continue to enter more competitions, to expose the children to a variety of new sports and competitions. This will all depend on the timing and schedule set by the Partnership with Yan.

#### Mentoring Sports mentoring program

The mentoring program is lead by Joe (SPEC training schools) this program is there to help with behaviour and guide children on how to become a role model. The children spend time with the SPEC training team, to understand how to become a better person and how to deal with situation which may materialise. Each week the children fill out work sheets with the coach, whilst getting to try various sports. The program is also now being used to reward the children in the school, who show the fantastic values of Ghyllgrove primary school. The children will have a fun sports session to celebrate their success.

### **Specialist Sports Coach:**

The sports leaders continue to support the coaches at lunchtimes, Joe (SPEC Training) takes the sports leaders out weekly to train them on new activities. The sports leader team currently, runs netball and football fixtures each lunch time. There is now a rota set at each lunchtime for different sports, for the sports leaders to lead each lunch.

The introduction of new KS1 sports leaders from year 1 &2 as worked really well. The sports leaders organise small sided games on the astro turf each lunchtime. We will Continue to develop High Quality Year 6, 5 & 4 Sports Leaders to support lunchtime activities (staff training and pupil development) including coaches in the lunch hour over the upcoming year.

#### <u>Team teaching with professional coaches to support the continuous professional</u> <u>development of staff. The school focus for 2022 to 2023 is Team Games and</u> <u>Multisport.</u>

We are working with SPEC Training Schools, who are offering our teachers team teach in team games. This half term Mr J, Pringle (KS2), Miss J, Robinson (KS2), Mrs A, Smith (KS2), Mr D, Collins (KS2) and Miss K, Wakeford (KS1) all received team teach sessions this half term. They have been working alongside Joe, Damon and Jack (SPEC Training Schools coaches) to develop their confidence and subject knowledge in the following team games: Football, cricket, basketball and netball. All teachers will be asked to complete a confidence measure questionnaire at the end to monitor the impact of team teach. This half term the teachers, will be introduced to hand ball and Touch ball.

Going forward for next year, the SPEC team will look to teach teachers skills to referee a variety of sports. This is so they can help with school fixtures, which will create more opportunities for children to have more competitive school fixtures.
