James Hornsby School Sports Partnership - (JHS)

We have joined the partnership again this year. As a school we are looking to attend as many sporting events as possible. Whilst trying to achieve the silver sports mark again. This will be under the guidance and support from Billy Hudson and Dan Cornwall SGO's from JHS.

Further development of Extra Curriculum Clubs and establishing links with local clubs

We are aiming to target as many pupils as possible across the school to attend extra curriculum PE. We have a KS1 and KS2 Multi-sports clubs Year 2 to Year 6, each year group has their own club. This is funded by sports premium. In addition a Year 1, Year 2 and Year 3 Football club is being run by the SPEC Training Team. The SPEC training team is currently supporting the KS2 football clubs so they can continue to run. In KS2 we have 8 Clubs, 4 of these clubs are funded by sports premium. In KS1 We have 3 clubs, 1 of these are funded by sports premium. All clubs in KS1 and KS2 is limited to 20 spaces. This half term we are now running a netball club after school on a Monday, this has been aimed at children in Year 5 and 6. From this club we will enter a netball team, to compete in the Leigh chapel tournament.

Once again, we will be tracking participation levels to ensure that we encourage as many pupils as possible to attend one or more extra curriculum hour for PE.

Team teaching with professional coaches to support the continuous professional development of staff. The school focus for 2021 to 2022 is Team Games and Multis-sports.

We are working with SPEC Training Schools, who are offering our teachers team teach in team games. This half term Mrs D Collier (KS2), Mrs S Bush (KS2), Miss P Hall (KS2) and Miss C Zell (KS2). They have been working alongside Joe and Damon (SPEC Training Schools coaches) to develop their confidence and subject knowledge in the following team games: Football. All teachers will be asked to complete a confidence measure questionnaire at the end to monitor the impact of team teach. This half term the teachers, will be introduced to hand ball and Tocukball.

Attendance at sporting events (coaches fees and transport costs)

Back in October, November and December we entered several competitions, due to COVID the sports partnership cancelled all tournaments. We are now working towards entering the cross country at the end of March. We will report our results in the next report.

Specialist Sports Coach:

- Continue to develop High Quality Year 6, 5 & 4 Sports Leaders to support lunchtime activities (staff training and pupil development) including coaches in the lunch hour

The sports leaders continue to support the coaches at lunchtimes, we have now introduced sports leaders to the KS1 playground. The feedback from the MDA's at lunchtime, have all said the sports leaders are having a positive impact on the playground. The sports leaders will support intra school competitions, which will be held on a Wednesday afternoon every 3-4 weeks. The points from the intra school competitions will go towards the final scores on sports day.

New sports leaders will be chosen for next term. This again will be done via the application process, allowing everyone in the school the opportunity to become a sports leader.

Replenish curriculum PE resources for whole class teaching, clubs and lunch-times.

The new football goals have now arrived, due to COVID we have been unable yet to play a game against another school. Instead an intra school game was held, led by Mr Davies and Joe (SPEC Training Schools). The new KS1 playground equipment has arrived, which has made an immediate impact, allowing the children to having more access to a variety of equipment.

Development of G & T across the school & sports mentoring program

Damon and Joe (SPEC Training Schools) are currently training the Gifted and Talented Group for the March cross country which is being held by the JHS partnership. They will also be working with the football team, which they are working towards getting fixtures organised with local schools in the area.

The mentoring program is lead by Joe (SPEC training schools) this program is there to help with behaviour and guide children on how to become a role model. The children spend time with the SPEC training team, to understand how to become a better person and how to deal with situation which may materialise. Each week the children fill out work sheets with the coach, whilst getting to try various sports. The program is also now being used to reward the children in the school, who show the values of Ghyllgrove primary school. The children will have a fun sports session to celebrate their success.
